Hosting organisation

The Regional Centre for the Safeguarding of Intangible Cultural Heritage in South-Eastern Europe under the auspices of UNESCO, inaugurated in 2012, is dedicated to the safeguarding and promoting of intangible cultural heritage (ICH), with the following main objectives:

- Raise awareness among young people about the safeguarding of intangible cultural heritage and its importance for sustainable development;

- Proactive involvement of young people in the decision-making processes regarding heritage, as well as in its safeguarding and its use for the purposes of sustainable development;
- Promotion of local entrepreneurship based on intangible cultural heritage.

Programme and working method

Programme filled with interesting activities based on non-formal and informal educational methods aimed at learning and exchanging knowledge about intangible cultural heritage in the region of South-East Europe:

- Ice-breakers and team building games to get to know each other;
- Interactive workshops with time for discussions and debates;
- Learning by doing method and fieldwork;
- Presentations of ICH by the participants and intercultural evenings.

The language of this training is **English**.

The detailed programme and schedule will be sent to the selected participants in a later stage.

Preparation for the youth exchange

- Research about inspiring traditions and customs from your country and present them in a Powerpoint presentation;
- Find interesting movies to present living heritage of your country;
- Select traditional music to teach the participants how to dance traditional dances;
- Bring some small amounts of traditional food, drink, snack to present your country in Intercultural evenings;
- Bring your photo camera and laptop/tablet (if possible, you will need it also for some activities);
- Bring the flag of your country.

Plovdiv

The project will take place in city of Plovdiv, Bulgaria.

Plovdiv is the second-largest city in Bulgaria and it is situated in the Upper Thracian Plain, on both banks of the Maritsa river. The town in its present appearance was built around seven hills – the hills of Plovdiv (Plovdiv Tepes) which are an inseparable part of the city's history.

Plovdiv is one of the oldest cities in Europe – the beginning of its history dates back to 4,000 years BC and has rich cultural heritage. The accumulated over the Three Hills layers contain some valuable proofs about the millenary development – marks from the prehistory, Thracian, Hellenic and Roman cultures, from the Middle Ages, the Ottoman period, the National revival and from the XX century.

In 2019 the city was European Capital of Culture and became a cultural hub in Bulgaria.

Travel Plan

Arrival day: 24 June 2024

- You need an approval of your travel plan. Please contact the team of the hosting organisation by sending via email your travel plan BEFORE purchasing the tickets.
- Before buying your ticket, please remember your cost limits, everything that will be more than the limit, will be at your own cost.

Reimbursement for travel

- 100% reimbursement for your travel costs according to the real spent cost, up to the approved travel budget for your country; higher costs are considered as your co-funding.
- Keep ALL YOUR ORIGINAL TICKETS AND INVOICES (either digital in PDF files or on paper) in order to be reimbursed (if you pay online you have to bring us the bank statement).
- On all documents the price, currency, name of the passenger, date of purchase and travel must be clearly visible, otherwise we will be unable to reimburse the costs.
- Travel expenses will be covered at the end of the youth exchange on the condition that you submit (bring/send) all original tickets and invoices for your travel.
- We reimburse the transport money ONLY if the participant will ACTIVELY take part during the whole project

Important information

- Bring with you all your travel documents and passport/ID.
- Travel insurance is your responsibility, so make sure you have one.
- For participants from EU countries the European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) is also applicable.
- Bring your medications, if you need any.
